More than 35 years held a part time position as social work lecturer at the School of Social Work Hanze University Groningen and is still in private practice as trainer in human needs and human rights focused Multi Method Social Work (MMSW) and as traumapsychologist and grieftherapist. He is a true ally of social work, because he believes in the strength of the normalizing and PIE-social work approach for working with socially, economically and politically vulnerable people.

In 2004 Herman published his second book titled, 'The social workers' toolbox. Sustainable Multi Method Social Work Practice Model' (in Dutch). In this book he proposes a model for empowering social work as a profession, a paradigm shift in social work. This model articulates the profession of social work promoting Quality of Life by working on addressing human needs and human rights; the model offers historically proven tools to work with clients not from a one-method-fits-for-all perspective but from a sustainable multimethod perspective (a flexible combination of 20 well written and evidence based & practice based methods)
