KICK-OFF | WORDS OF WELCOME AND INTRODUCTION TO THE PROGRAM

HELENA CARREIRAS, Director of the School of Sociology and Public Policy, ISCTE-IUL



Helena Carreiras is an Associate Professor of Sociology, Public Policy and Research Methodology at ISCTE - University Institute of Lisbon (ISCTE-IUL), and a senior researcher at the Centre for Research and Studies in Sociology (CIES- IUL). Currently she is the dean of the School of Sociology and Public Policy of ISCTE-IUL and the president of the European Association ERGOMAS (European Research Group on Military and Society). She holds a PhD in Social and Political Sciences from the European University Institute (Florence). Between 2010 and 2012, she was deputy-director of the Portuguese National Defence Institute and in 2014 she was Visiting Professor at the University of Georgetown (Department of Government). Her research interests are in gender and society, armed forces, civil-military relations, security and defence public policies and qualitative research methodology. Her work has focused on gender integration in military institutions and gender aspects of international security. She is the co-editor of *Researching the Military* (Routledge, 2016, with Celso Castro and Sabina Frederic), *Qualitative Methods in Military Studies* (Routledge, 2013, with Celso Castro) and *Women in the Military and in Armed Conflict*, (Vs Verlag, 2008, with Gerhard Kuemmel), and the author of *Gender and the Military. Women in the Armed Forces of Western Democracies* (London, Routledge, 2006).

CHRISTOF WEIL, Ambassador of the Federal Republic of Germany in Portugal



Christof Weil was born in Heilbronn, Germany in 1954. He is a German diplomat and the ambassador in Lisbon, Portugal (since September 2016). He was previously the German ambassador in Kiev (2012-2016), Minsk (2010-2012) and in Bagdad (2008-2009). Previously he was posted in Warsaw (1994-1997), Brasília (1989-1991), Moscow (1986-1989) and in the German Foreign Office in Berlin. Weil was a member of the Parliament from 2009 to 2010. He holds a PhD and a law degree from Heidelberg University. Weil was also a fellow at Weatherhead Centre for International Affairs at Harvard University and an International Secretariat of NATO.

RUI VINHAS, Director-General of European Affairs, Portuguese Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Lisbon



Rui Vinhas was born in December 1964. Plenipotentiary Minister as of 2013, he holds the position of Director-General for European Affairs at the Portuguese Ministry of Foreign Affairs since September 2017. He graduated in Law from the Faculty of Law of the University of Lisbon and started his diplomatic career in 1992. At the beginning of his career, he held positions dealing with multilateral affairs (UN and NATO), having integrated the Permanent Mission of Representation to the United Nations, in New York, from 1997 to 2000 (including during the Portuguese mandate to the UN Security Council in 1997-1998). During that period, he also occupied the post of Vice-President of the UN Disarmament Commission.

Upon returning to Lisbon in 2000, he assumed the position of Assistant in the Cabinet of the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the XIV Constitutional Government until 2002. Afterwards, he assumed the post of Diplomatic Advisor to the President of the Republic between 2003 and 2005. Between 2005 and 2010, he became Deputy Head of Mission at the Embassy of Portugal in Madrid, after which he returned to Lisbon to hold the position of Department Director for the Americas at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Between 2011 and 2015, he was the Deputy Director-General for Foreign Policy. As such, he was also National Coordinator for the Ibero-American Conference (2011 and 2012), Vice-President of the National Human Rights Commission (2011-2015) and National Coordinator for the Alliance of Civilizations (2012 and 2015). Between 2015 and 2017, he returned to the field of multilateral affairs as a Permanent Representative to the Political and Security Committee (PSC) of the European Union, at the Permanent Mission of Representation of Portugal to the European Union in Brussels. He has authored several articles on international relations and Portuguese foreign policy, published in academic journals.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

ANTONIO VITORINO, IOM Director General



António Vitorino was born January 12, 1957, in Lisbon. He earned a degree from the University of Lisbon's School of Law in 1981, as well as a Master's Degree in Legal and Political Science. He has authored works on Constitutional Law, Political Science, European Community Law, and was also a member of the Drafting Committee of the Portuguese White Book on Corporate Governance. He is Director General of IOM since 1 October 2018. He is a former European Commissioner for Justice and Home Affairs (1999-2004) and former Minister of the Presidency and National Defense (1995-1997). He has also enjoyed a distinguished career in Portugal as a lawyer as well as in electoral politics. He was elected to Portugal's Parliament in 1980. In 1983 he became Secretary of State for Parliamentary Affairs. He later served as Deputy Secretary for the Governor of Macau until 1989, when he returned to Lisbon to become a judge of the Constitutional Court for five years. He subsequently served as Minister for National Defence and Deputy Prime Minister in the government of António Guterres, now the United Nations' Secretary General.

FRANCESCO VACCHIANO, Assistant Researcher, Institute of Social Sciences, ICS-ULisboa



Francesco Vacchiano is an anthropologist and a clinical psychologist with interests in migration, medical and psychological anthropology, European borders and boundaries, bureaucracies and politics of citizenship, as well as societies and institutions in North Africa. He joined research and clinical practice in the applied fields of mental health and migration (ethnopsychology), carrying out his professional activity in Italy and Portugal. He conducted

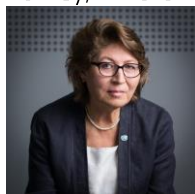
research in Morocco, Tunisia and in Southern Europe on some of the main profiles of contemporary human mobility ('unaccompanied minors', refugees and 'victims of trafficking') and on the policies and practices of their inclusion/exclusion. He is currently studying the expectations related to activism and social participation in North Africa. He has taught in programmes in anthropology, psychology, social working, Mediterranean and North African studies in Italy, Spain, Portugal and Switzerland.

He is principal investigator of the exploratory project "Globally Sensitive: Revolt, Citizenship, and Expectations for the Future in North Africa", funded by the Portuguese research council ("Fundação para a Ciência e a Tecnologia") (2015-2020). IRENA VOJÁČKOVÁ-SOLLORANO, UN Resident Coordinator to the Republic of Turkey, Ankara



Ms Irena Vojáčková-Sollorano has been appointed as the UN Resident Coordinator to Turkey as of 1st of January 2019.

She held both the positions of the UN Resident Coordinator and UNDP Resident Representative to the Republic of Turkey since December 2016. Previously, she was the UN Resident Coordinator and UNDP Resident Representative to the Republic of Serbia as of October 2013. In this capacity, she led the UN country team's response to the historic floods in 2014 and to the refugee/migrant

crisis in 2015/16.

Prior to this appointment, she has worked in different capacities for 28 years for the International Organization for Migration (IOM) as Director of the Department for Migration Management in IOM Headquarters, Regional Director in Asia and Central Europe. She has gained global migration expertise in Migration and Development, Labour Migration, Refugee Resettlement, Border Management, Smuggling, Integration, Trafficking and Emergency Response. Over the years, she was a member of several internal change-management teams, board member of regional research institutions and also has developed strong collaborations with think tanks.

She holds a Diploma of the Asian Institute of Management, Manila, Philippines; Diploma of the Diplomatic Academy in Vienna, Austria; M.A. in History, Geography, and International Law from the University of Vienna, Austria and a B.A. in History and Political Science from the University of Heidelberg, Germany.

MICHELE AMEDEO, Head of Centre of Thematic Expertise on Migration, European Commission, DG NEAR-B (Southern Neighbourhood)



Michele Amedeo is the Head of the Centre of Thematic Expertise on Migration at the European Commission, Directorate General for Neighbourhood and Enlargement (DG NEAR). He has been the leading voice on increasing EU efforts to address the migration crisis across the Mediterranean for the past two years. From 1998 to 2000, he managed the EU Multi-Beneficiary Environmental Programmes to prepare Central and Eastern European countries for EU membership. In 2001, he became Deputy Head of Office for the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) in China. In 2003, he directed the Programme for Environmental Protection of the Italian Ministry of Environment in China. In 2004, he returned to the European Commission as Head of the Operational Section to the EU

Delegation in Benin, where he remained until 2008. From 2009 to 2011, he was Global Risk Advisor to the Director General for Enlargement and was later responsible for the coordination of EU funding instruments for the Enlargement countries (Western Balkans and Turkey) and the EU Neighbourhood.

Mr Amedeo holds a MSc in Environmental Engineering from the Royal Institute of Technology (KTH) in Stockholm, a MSc in Civil Engineering from Politecnico di Milano, and a General Management Certificate from the McCombs School of Business, University of Texas at Austin. He is a visiting professor on international cooperation and the author of articles on global challenges, migration, and the EU in the world.

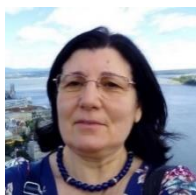

LUCINDA FONSECA, IGOT, Universidade de Lisboa



She is Full Professor of Human Geography and Migration Studies at the Institute of Geography and Spatial Planning (IGOT) at the Universidade de Lisboa. She is also the director of the PhD Programme on Migration Studies as well as the coordinator of the Research cluster MIGRARE - Migration, spaces and societies at the Centre for Geographical Studies (CEG) of the same institute. Her current research activities focus on migration dynamics, migrant transnationalism, mobilities and urban transformation; migration, demographic change and regional development.

She is a member of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Board of the IMISCOE research network (International Migration, Integration and Social Cohesion in Europe) and of the International Steering Committee of the International Metropolis Project. She coordinated and participated in several national and European research projects in the fields of international migration, demography, urban transformation dynamics and regional and urban planning, as well as development. She has published extensively in Portugal and abroad.

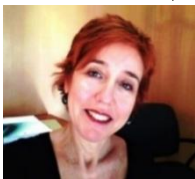
VASCO MALTA, Head of the Department of Migration Policy, International Relations, Enrolment of Migrants, High Commissioner for Migration (ACM)

He has a degree in Law and LLM in European Law in a Global Context, by the Catholic School of Law. He has been a lawyer since 2005 and began his work in the area of human rights at the High Commission for Migration and Intercultural Dialogue in Portugal in 2009. ANDREAS BÜTTNER, State Secretary in the Ministry for Labor, Social Affairs, Health, Women and Family of the State of Brandenburg

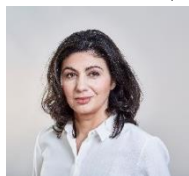

Before assuming the current position of Secretary of State, she has served in the European External Action Service as European Union Ambassador to Colombia and Ecuador since 2015 and previously as EU Ambassador to Brazil since 2011. In Portugal, she was Vice-President of the Instituto Camões, Consultant for International Relations in the Presidency of the Republic, Director of the Press and Information Services of the MNE, Representative of the MNE in the Pavilion of Portugal and the Portuguese Communities during Expo 98, Secretary of Embassy in the Services of the State Protocol and the Directorate of Services of Europe.
